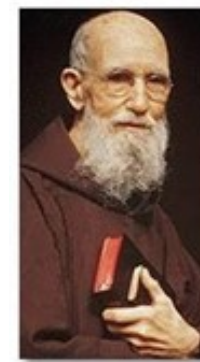

Pope Francis announced that Fr. Solanus Casey has met the requirement for beatification and will be named "blessed" He is the second man born in the United States to achieve such a designation.

Significant dates in the Life of the Venerable Father Solanus Casey

- Nov 25, 1870—Bernard Casey (Fr. Solanus) born near Prescott, Wisconsin
- 1892—Studies at St. Francis DeSales Seminary, Milwaukee, WI
- Dec 24, 1896—Arrived at St. Bonaventure Monastery, Detroit, MI
- Mar 20, 1904—Ordained a Deacon at St. Francis Church, Milwaukee, WI
- July 24, 1904—Ordained a Priest at St. Francis Church, Milwaukee, WI
- Aug 4, 1904—Arrived at Sacred Heart Parish, Yonkers, NY, his first assignment
- July, 1918—Transferred to Our Lady of Sorrows, New York, NY
- Oct 25, 1921—Transferred to Our Lady Queen of Angels, New York, NY
- Aug 1, 1924— Arrived at St. Bonaventure Friary, Detroit, MI, a new assignment
- July 23, 1945—Trasferred to St. Michael's Parish, Brooklyn, NY
- Apr 25, 1946—semi-retired at St. Felix Friary, Huntington, IN
- Spring 1956 —Returns to Detroit for medical treatments
- July 31, 1957— Gives up his soul to God, death at St. John's Hospital, Detroit, MI
- Aug 3, 1957—Buried, St. Bonaventure Friary Cemetery, Detroit, MI
- July 8, 1987—Body exhumed, then re-interred in St. Bonaventure Chapel
- July 11, 1995—Pope John Paul II declared Solanus Casey Venerable
