Relocation of Sacred Imagery

Some people have asked what happened to...

The statue of the Sacred Heart which was in the Sanctuary
is now in the Shrine of the Sacred Heart in the back of the church.

The statue of St. Clare which was in the Monastery side of the
Sanctuary was a gift from St. John's in New York. It was relocated to
the entrance of St. Clare's Friary. The retirement community did not
have a statue of St. Clare and was thrilled to have an image of their
patron.

In order to create space for the Shrine of the Sacred Heart:

The 8th Station of the cross was moved forward.

We also moved the 7th Station to create symmetry.

Both are now on the wall opposite the Shrine of Solanus Casey.

Flags

Shrine of the Sacred Heart

In preparation for the celebration of the 125th anniversary of the founding of
Sacred Heart Parish, a Shrine of the Sacred Heart was created. Ben Glasser
created the Shrine in the back of the church using 100 year old wood from the
pews and the altar rails. This railing once separated the Sanctuary from the nave of
the church. They were removed in the early 1970s.

The niche on the upper part of the Shrine was part of the high altar of the original
church and dates back to 1891. Fr. Solanus Casey celebrated Mass at that altar.
The statue of the Sacred Heart was not part of the original church, but is obviously
befitting of this piece of art.

We hope this addition will be meaningful to all as we celebrate our 125 years!

Donation Boxes

Please notice that there have been a few changes to the Donation Boxes.
The two boxes at the St. Anthony Shrine are now both Vigil Lights.
The box on the back wall of the church, Convent Ave. side, has been designated
for the Vigil Lights for the Shrine of the Sacred Heart.
The box on the back wall, Monastery side, remains the Donation Box for the Poor
of St. Vincent DePaul.
There are two boxes in the vestibule of the church. The box by the choir door, St.
Anthony's Alms, goes to the Province of St. Mary to aid in their mission of helping
the poor. The box by the Usher's Room, will be used for books and pamphlets for
the various times we order books for parishioners.

Pew Engravings

At present, there are 18 pews still available for engraving. If you would like to

contact the Parish Offices this week. An additional plaque will be installed in
the vestibule of the church. The plaque will be 4 columns resembling the pews
